

The Klamath Tribe's strategy for their Aurora Project

- The Klamath Tribe's Restoration Act (Section 6, 25 United States Code 566d) a stand alone, mandatory Federal statute, enables the Klamath Tribe to take land into trust anywhere within the boundaries of the State of Oregon.
- That Federal statute mandates that land to be taken into trust for the benefit of the Klamath Tribe without input from local or state officials, without input from the public and without an Environmental Impact Statement.
- The validity of statute has been researched and confirmed by the law firm of Holland & Knight at their Los Angeles offices.
- The statute has been researched and confirmed by the BIA, both at the regional and national offices.
- The statute has already been utilized in the past by the Klamath Tribe, multiple times.
- The BIA has offered an expedited process for the Klamath Tribe to move the Aurora properties into trust for the Tribe.
- The Klamath Tribe has three separate and very capable large development groups that are prepared to fund the purchase of the Aurora properties for the Klamath Tribe. (+/- \$100M)
- The three development groups are prepared to completely fund the development of the properties for the Klamath Tribe. (+/- \$500M)
- The three development groups have had their own attorneys independently research and confirm the Klamath Restoration Act. Group number two has a very large law firm in Michigan; group number three has a very large law firm in Washington D.C.
- The three development groups are prepared to fund all of the legal expenses for the land into trust process.

- The Klamath Tribe and its attorneys intend to move the land into trust ASAP, within this current federal administration.
- The Tribe will move the land into trust and create a Klamath Tribe reservation.
- Upon the creation of this reservation all land contiguous to the reservation can then also be taken into trust for the Klamath Tribe with very little effort.
- Once the lands are in trust and the Klamath Tribe reservation is created, gaming can be developed because it is no longer "off reservation".
- The Klamath Tribe's representatives and their attorneys as well as the primary development group and their attorneys will be meeting with the land owners and their attorneys on June 16th, 2008 in Portland Oregon to present an official written offer to purchase the properties.
- A current title report will be available at that meeting in anticipation of the offer being accepted.
- If the offer is acceptable to the land owners, documents will immediately be executed and funding will be immediately released to secure the purchase.
- In the event that the offer is not acceptable to the sellers, all of the attorneys will be present to groom the offer or to negotiate.
